SENIOR STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING OF PROPOSALS SUBMITTED UNDER THE BOARD OF REGENTS SUPPORT FUND COMPETITIVE AND MATCHING GRANTS PROGRAMS, FY 2012-13

SECTION A: INTRODUCTION

A.1 Constitutionally Prescribed Program Components

The Constitution specifies that the Board of Regents Support Fund may be used to support any or all of the following programs:

- a. The carefully defined research efforts at public and private universities in Louisiana;
- b. The endowment of chairs for eminent scholars;
- c. The enhancement of the quality of academic, research or agricultural departments or units within a university; and
- d. The recruitment of superior graduate students.

A.2 FY 2012-13 Board of Regents Support Fund Plan and Budget

a. Projected Budget and Funds Available

On December 7, 2011, the Board of Regents adopted the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget for the Board of Regents Support Fund, which was later approved by the Governor and the Legislature. Based on Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) projections, the Plan and Budget allocated \$27,500,000 across Support Fund components as follows:

b. Actual Funds Available

Since approval of the FY 2012-13 BoRSF Plan and Budget in December 2012, the REC has issued several opinions relative to the amount of money projected to be available for higher education's portion of the Support Fund. The most recent estimate, released in December 2012, was \$23,850,000. This projection is significantly lower than the previous REC guidance and projections used to derive the approved Plan and Budget. As a result, substantial reductions in anticipated first-year funds must be taken in the competitive Enhancement and Research and Development (R&D) program components.

In addition, Regent Roy Martin, Chair of the Sponsored Programs Committee, persuaded the State Treasurer's Office to realize additional gains of approximately \$5,020,000 in FY 2012-13 to help address the Endowed Professorships backlog of 346 \$40,000 matching slots reported by campuses on July 2, 2012.

The recommendations below reflect the programmatic distribution of available funds across all BoRSF components.

SECTION B: ENHANCEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF DEPARTMENTS OR UNITS COMPONENT

B.1 Endowed Professorships Program

The Board of Regents Support Fund Endowed Professorships Program requires the submitting college or university to raise at least \$60,000 from external sources, which is matched by \$40,000 from the Support Fund, thus establishing an endowed professorship valued at a minimum of \$100,000. The program policy guarantees two \$40,000 matching slots to each four-year and special purpose campus, and one \$40,000 matching slot to each two-year campus.

a. Endowed Professorships: Backlog

With all requests validated, the Board received by the March 31, 2013 deadline applications from prior years for 328 Endowed Professorship \$40,000 slots requiring \$13,120,000 in BoRSF matching funds. A total of \$6,560,000 is available to fund the Endowed Professorships backlog: \$5,020,000 in additional realized gains, unclaimed funds of \$1,160,000 budgeted for new Endowed Professorships in FY 2012-13 (see Section B.1.b), and unclaimed funds of \$380,000 budgeted for new Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships in FY 2012-13 (See Section B.2). The \$6,560,000 will fund 164 previously submitted applications for Professorship slots across 20 campuses. These are allocated among campuses consistent with the Regents' well-established practice: based on slots submitted, equal slots are funded for affected campuses until the total \$6,560,000 available is disbursed. (See **Appendix A.**) A complete list of Endowed Professorship applications submitted for funding consideration in FY 2012-13 appears in **Appendix B.**

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve \$6,560,000 from the Support Fund to match 164 Endowed Professorships submissions unfunded in previous years. (See Appendix A.)

b. Endowed Professorships: New Applications

FY 2012-13 Support Fund Plan and Budget allocates a total of \$1,600,000 to the Endowed Professorships Program. With all requests validated, the Board received by the March 31 deadline applications for eleven (11) new professorships slots, requiring \$440,000 in BoRSF matching funds. (See **Appendix C.**) Remaining funds of \$1,160,000 budgeted for Endowed Professorships shall be used to match previously submitted requests. (See Section B.1.a, above.) A complete list of Endowed Professorships applications submitted for funding consideration in FY 2012-13 appears in **Appendix B.**

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve \$440,000 from the Support Fund to match eleven (11) new submissions to the Endowed Professorships program. (See Appendix C.)

B.2 First-Generation Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships

The Board of Regents Support Fund Endowed Professorships program requires a submitting four-year college or university to raise at least \$60,000 from external or institutional sources, which is matched by \$40,000 from the Support Fund, thus establishing an endowed scholarship valued at a minimum of \$100,000; two-year campuses must provide \$30,000, to be matched with \$20,000 from the Support Fund to establish an endowed scholarship valued at a minimum of \$50,000.

The FY 2012-13 Support Fund Plan and Budget allocates a total of \$1,000,000 to the Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships Program for the establishment of at least 25 endowed scholarships for first-generation undergraduate students. With all disciplines eligible and all requests validated, the Board has received applications for the matching of one (1) \$20,000 and fifteen (15) \$40,000 scholarship matches. It would require \$620,000 to fund all submissions. Unclaimed funds of \$380,000 budgeted for Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships matches shall be transferred to the Endowed Professorships program to match previously submitted requests. (See Section B.1.a, above.) A list of applications appears in **Appendix D**.

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve \$620,000 to match the sixteen (16) applications submitted in FY 2012-13 under the First-Generation Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships Program. (See Appendix D.)

B.3 Recommended New Traditional, Undergraduate and Two-Year Institutions Enhancement Projects

The \$14,269,505 figure cited in the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget for Enhancement includes the following distributions:

The five eligible disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement and Undergraduate Enhancement Program components in FY 2012-13 are agricultural sciences, arts, earth and environmental sciences, engineering A, and health and medical sciences. The Enhancement Program for Two-Year Institutions identifies guiding principles for proposal development rather than limiting submissions by academic discipline.

In the winter of 2012 and spring of 2013, eight teams of out-of-state consultants reviewed, evaluated and ranked the various types of competitive Enhancement proposals. Using the Board’s evaluation criteria, five teams evaluated, rated and ranked Traditional Enhancement proposals in the five eligible disciplines; the sixth, seventh and eighth teams, respectively, evaluated, rated and ranked Multidisciplinary Enhancement, Undergraduate Enhancement, and Enhancement for Two-Year Institutions programs. Each team had appropriate expertise and experience relative to the specific requirements of the discipline and/or component being reviewed.

With the exception of the Multidisciplinary component, the allocation level for each of the eligible disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement Program was determined by calculating proposal pressure and the amount of Support Fund money requested per discipline as a percentage of the total proposal pressure and amount of Support Fund money requested across these five disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement component. As stipulated in the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget, Multidisciplinary Enhancement was calculated as 20% of the total available. The total maximum funding anticipated to be available based on allocations in the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget for meritorious proposals in each of the disciplines in Traditional Enhancement was calculated as follows:

These amounts helped to guide consultants in the development of funding recommendations. Senior Staff Recommendations

- 1. Traditional Enhancement: The \$3,246,188 available and recommended for expenditure shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with the funding stipulations recommended**

by consultants, and shall be divided among the five eligible disciplines and multidisciplinary projects as follows (see Appendix E):

2. **Undergraduate Enhancement Program: A total of \$1,042,040 is recommended for expenditure for the top fifteen (15) Undergraduate Enhancement proposals submitted in FY 2012-13. Proposals shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with the funding stipulations recommended by consultants. (See Appendix F.)**
3. **Enhancement Program for Two-Year Institutions: The \$741,106 recommended for expenditure for the top eight (8) Enhancement Program for Two-Year Institutions proposals submitted in FY 2012-13. Proposals shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with funding stipulations recommended by consultants. (See Appendix G.)**
4. **Should the amount of money ultimately available to fund first-year activities in Traditional, Undergraduate, and Enhancement Program for Two-Year Institutions projects be less than the \$5,029,334 disbursed herein, the following principles shall apply: (1) All Support Fund money shall be awarded in rank order, at funding levels and with stipulations recommended by consultants; (2) if the remaining money in the budget for a particular component or discipline is insufficient to fully fund the next recommended proposal for that component or discipline, the remaining funds shall constitute the total award for that proposal; and (3) should an institution refuse or be denied an award, that money shall be awarded to the next highest ranked proposal within that component or discipline. (See Appendices E, F, G and H.)**

Appendix H summarizes – by campus and Enhancement component – the recommendations for new projects under the competitive Enhancement programs.

SECTION C: ENDOWED CHAIRS FOR EMINENT SCHOLARS COMPONENT

C.1 Competitive Endowed Chairs Program

Fourteen (14) proposals were submitted for funding consideration this year under the Competitive Program. Ten (10) proposals requested \$400,000 each from the Support Fund to endow \$1 million chairs; four (4) proposals requested \$800,000 each from the Support Fund to endow \$2 million chairs.

C.2 Restricted Bequest Endowed Chairs Program

Two (2) Restricted Bequest proposals, one (1) requesting \$400,000 from the Support Fund to endow a \$1 million chair and one (1) requesting \$800,000 from the Support Fund to endow a \$2 million chair, were submitted in FY 2012-13.

C.3 Summary of the Endowed Chairs for Eminent Scholars Program

The Board received sixteen (16) Endowed Chairs proposals requesting a total of \$8,400,000 in matching funds from the Support Fund. All disciplines were eligible to apply. A team of out-of-state consultants came to Louisiana in March 2013 to interview campus representatives, evaluate the proposals, and rank them using the guidelines provided in the Board's RFP and program policy. (See **Appendix I** for the rank-order list of FY 2012-13 Endowed Chairs proposals.)

It should be noted that the following stipulation in the Board's Endowed Chairs policy must be applied to the fourteen (14) proposals submitted in the Competitive Program: "...When requests exceed funds available, the following limitations apply relative to the amount of money that will be awarded per campus under the competitive program: (a) each public campus will be limited to \$1.2 million per fiscal year; and (b) all LAICU campuses combined will be limited to a total of \$1.2 million per fiscal year." The policy further stipulates that "Chairs awarded to institutions of higher education as a result of bequests shall not count toward the monetary limitations set forth in...this policy," cited above.

The \$3,220,000 projected in the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget to be available in the Endowed Chairs for Eminent Scholars Program includes \$20,000 for consultants. The remaining amount of \$3,200,000 will enable funding for proposals ranked 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 in the Competitive Program and the proposal received in the Restricted Bequests Program from LSU and A&M College. It is unlikely in the current economic environment that supplementary money will be available to fund additional Endowed Chairs requests.

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve provision of Support Fund money at levels requested to complete the endowments for proposals ranked 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 in the Consultants' Report (i.e., proposals 014EC, 002EC, 007EC, 008EC, and 011EC). The Senior Staff further recommends providing Support Fund money at the level requested to complete the endowment for Restricted Bequest proposal 016EC. (See Appendix I.)

SECTION D: RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT COMPONENT

D.1 Continuation of Previously Funded Research and Development (R&D) Projects and Other Prior Commitments

The \$5,235,000 cited in the FY 2012-13 Plan and Budget as being available for Research and Development (R&D) includes amounts for prior commitments to Support Fund awards approved in previous years as well as approximately \$150,000 in consultants' costs for the FY 2012-13 R&D review process.

D.2 Recommended New Research and Development Projects

R&D Program components include the Research Competitiveness Subprogram (RCS), the Industrial Ties Research Subprogram (ITRS), and the Awards to Louisiana Artists and Scholars (ATLAS) Subprogram. RCS solicits proposals that strengthen the research foundations and competitiveness of Louisiana colleges and universities and help to promote long-term economic development. ITRS targets proposals that support research with significant near-term potential for development and diversification of Louisiana's economic base. ATLAS seeks major scholarly and artistic endeavors from the arts, humanities, and social sciences with potential for broad impact on regional, national and/or international levels.

Eligible disciplines in RCS for FY 2012-13 were biological sciences, chemistry, computer/information sciences, earth and environmental sciences, engineering B (industrial, materials, mechanical, etc.), and health and medical sciences. Since 1993 ITRS has invited ideas across all disciplines for applied research projects that might promote

near-term economic development in the State; therefore, no specific target areas or disciplines are defined. ATLAS accepts proposals in all arts, humanities and social sciences disciplines.

From November 2012 through March 2013, approximately 285 mail and subject-area reviewers and three final panels reviewed, evaluated, and ranked research proposals according to the Board’s RFP guidelines and evaluation criteria. The final panels highly recommended for funding the top-ranked twenty-six (26) proposals in RCS (\$1,223,937 in first-year funds), seven (7) proposals in ITRS (\$477,338 in first-year funds), and twenty-five (25) proposals in ATLAS (\$988,776 in first-year funds). (See **Appendix J**.) It would require a total of \$2,690,051 to fund the first year of all new R&D awards rated Priority I by consultants.

The following table summarizes panel recommendations for the three R&D subprograms:

Senior Staff Recommendations

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve disbursement of \$1,669,678 estimated to be available in FY 2012-13 to fund the first year of new RCS, ITRS, and ATLAS projects as follows:

1. **Research Competitiveness Subprogram: \$903,113**
2. **Industrial Ties Research Subprogram: \$432,338**
3. **Awards to Louisiana Artists and Scholars Subprogram: \$334,227**

Approved R&D proposals shall be funded at the levels and with the stipulations recommended by consultants. Support Fund money shall be awarded to fund at recommended levels the top nineteen (19) RCS proposals, six (6) ITRS proposals, and eight (8) ATLAS proposals. In addition, the following principles shall apply: (1) should an institution refuse or be denied an award, or should FY 2012-13 money be returned from previously funded R&D contracts, that money shall be offered to the next-ranked proposal which the consultants recommended for Priority I funding within the respective subprogram, subject to availability of funds; (2) if the remaining money in the budget for a particular component is insufficient to fully fund the next-ranked recommended proposal for that component, the remaining funds shall constitute the total award for that proposal; and (3) if there are no remaining Priority I proposals in a particular subprogram the money shall be awarded in descending rank order to Priority I proposal(s) in another R&D subprogram. Should the amount of money ultimately available to fund first-year activities in all R&D projects be less than the \$1,669,678 disbursed herein, adherence to the following principles shall be uniformly enforced: R&D Priority I proposals shall be funded in rank order at the levels and the durations and with the stipulations recommended by consultants until the funds designated for each component have been exhausted. (See Appendix J.)

Appendix J also includes a summary, by campus and R&D subprogram, of new projects recommended for funding.

SECTION E: RECRUITMENT OF SUPERIOR GRADUATE STUDENTS COMPONENT

E.1 Traditional Graduate Fellowships and Graduate Fellowships for Teachers

Awards must be made under the Recruitment of Superior Graduate Students Program component more than one year prior to the time that funds are provided for the first year of the fellowship, since at least one year is required to conduct student recruitment activities, and committed for all remaining years to ensure ongoing student support.

The eleven eligible disciplines in the Traditional Graduate Fellows component in FY 2012-13 are agricultural sciences, biological sciences, business, chemistry, computer and information sciences, earth and environmental sciences, education, engineering A and B, health and medical sciences, mathematics, and physics and astronomy.

In February 2013, a team of out-of-state consultants with expertise in both doctoral and master’s-level programs reviewed, rated and ranked thirty-one (31) Traditional Graduate Fellowships proposals and one (1) Graduate Fellowships for Teachers proposal in accordance with the Board’s evaluation criteria. A total of \$2,582,000 in first-year funds was requested in Traditional Graduate Fellowships and \$120,000 in Graduate Fellowships for Teachers. Consultants were informed that \$900,000 in first-year funds was allocated in the Plan and Budget for new Graduate Fellowships projects, up to 20% of which could be set aside for meritorious Graduate Fellowships for Teachers applications. All funded projects will begin in FY 2014-15.

Of the proposals submitted, the consultants recommended twenty (20) Traditional Graduate Fellowships applications and the single Graduate Fellowships for Teachers proposal for funding, for a total first-year expenditure of \$899,500. (See **Appendix K.**)

Available monies will allow funding for the ten (10) top-ranked Traditional proposals, for a total first-year allocation of \$531,500. The single Graduate Fellowships for Teachers is recommended for first-year funding of \$80,000. Yearly funding totals for all recommended proposals are:

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve funding for the ten (10) top-ranked proposals submitted in the FY 2012-13 cycle for the Recruitment of Superior Graduate Students Traditional component and the one (1) proposal submitted in the Graduate Fellowships for Teachers component for the durations and at the levels recommended by consultants. (See Appendix K.)

E.2 BoRSF/Southern Regional Education Board Fellowships to Promote Diversity Program

Five (5) institutions submitted a total of five (5) proposals requesting funds for the support of 19 doctoral fellows in the FY 2012-13 competitive cycle for this component. (See **Appendix K.**) A total of \$475,000 in first-year funds was requested. Consultants recommended support for all five (5) applications, for which funding will begin in FY 2013-14.

Available monies will allow funding for the three (3) top-ranked proposals, for a total first-year allocation of \$200,000. For the recommended proposals, the yearly funding totals are:

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve funding for the three (3) top-ranked proposals submitted in the FY 2012-13 cycle to the BoR/SREB Graduate Fellowships to Promote Diversity Program for the durations and at the levels recommended by consultants. (See Appendix K.)

Appendix K also contains a summary of the recommendations of new Traditional Graduate Fellowships, Graduate Fellowships for Teachers, and BoR/SREB Graduate Fellowships proposals solicited in FY 2012-13, for which funding will begin in FY 2013-14 and FY 2014-15.

SECTION F: CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR BUDGETARY SHORTFALL

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve the following contingency plan for a budgetary shortfall: should the final FY 2012-13 Support Fund budget not achieve the amount cited herein, any shortfall shall be accommodated through a proportionate reduction in the amounts allocated for proposals in the competitive Enhancement and Research and Development program components.

AGENDA ITEM IV

Survey of Campus Vacancies: Previously Matched BoRSF Endowed Chairs and Endowed Professorships

Background Information

The Board of Regents collects data annually relative to the performance of Board of Regents Support Fund-matched Endowment programs. These reports include fund balances, expenditures, and existing vacancies.

Staff Summary

Annual endowment reports, submitted in December 2012, indicate that 37% of Endowed Chairs and 25% of Endowed Professorships currently matched by the BoRSF are not assigned to a faculty recipient. The Board has received incomplete data on the duration of these vacancies. To ensure that the Board has sufficient information to determine appropriate policies for these programs, a statewide survey is needed to collect information on current vacancies and their durations.

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends that the Board charge the Sponsored Programs staff to conduct a survey of all affected campuses to determine – effective April 1, 2013 – Endowed Chairs and Endowed Professorships vacancies and their durations. Survey responses will be due to the Board by May 31, 2013, with results to be furnished to the Sponsored Programs Committee.

AGENDA ITEM V

Request from Nicholls State University to Divide the Otto Candies Endowed Chair in Business Information Systems

Background Information

The Otto Candies Endowed Chair in Business Information Systems is a \$1 million endowed chair established in FY 2000-01 at Nicholls State University. The Chair is currently vacant.

Staff Summary

In August 2011, the Board of Regents approved the division of Endowed Chairs funds to establish Endowed Professorships at a minimum level of \$250,000. Pursuant to this policy, Nicholls State University was granted approval in December 2011 to divide an Endowed Chair into three Endowed Professorships, and in June 2012 to divide an Endowed Chair into two Endowed Professorships.

Nicholls State University now requests authorization to divide the Otto Candies Chair into three Endowed Professorships in the following names and amounts:

- The Captain Otto B. Candies Professorship in Maritime Management at \$500,000;
- The Candies Family Professorship in Business at \$250,000; and
- The Candies Family Professorship in Business at \$250,000

Correspondence related to this request is included in Appendix A.

Senior Staff Recommendation

Consistent with the August 2011 policy, the Senior Staff recommends that the Board approve the division of the Otto Candies Endowed Chair in Business Information Systems into three (3) endowed professorships as follows: (1) The Captain Otto B. Candies Professorship in Maritime Management at \$500,000; (2) The Candies Family Professorship in Business at \$250,000; and (3) The Candies Family Professorship in Business at \$250,000.



The law further requires that the appropriate management board authorize the establishment of such endowed chairs prior to submission to the Board of Regents for matching funds.

Nicholls State University requests approval to change the Otto Candies Endowed Chair in Information Systems into three "super" endowed professorships, one at the \$500,000 endowment and two at the \$250,000 endowment level. Approval of this request will increase the number of Endowed Professorships at Nicholls State University to 54 and decrease the Endowed Chairs to 3.



Funding Recommendations for Proposals Submitted Under the Louisiana Systemic Initiatives (LaSIP) Program

Background Information

The Louisiana Systemic Initiatives Program (LaSIP) was established during 1991-92 to improve mathematics and science education through a \$10 million NSF grant, combined with matching Support Fund dollars from the Board of Regents and the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. These monies have been combined with annual resources from U.S. Department of Education post-Sputnik programs, originally labeled the “Eisenhower” program, and now No Child Left Behind (NCLB). LaSIP’s signature effort has been statewide university-based Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) professional development for K-12 teachers. Since NSF and Support Fund dollars no longer exist for LaSIP, the K-20 LaSIP Council, specially formed for the program, has ceased to function.

Staff Summary

Currently, the only remaining dollars available for LaSIP, approximately \$1.5 million, are those annually allocated to the Board of Regents through NCLB. Federal regulations require that these dollars be competitively awarded to university-based professional development projects for K-12 teachers.

After reviewing thirteen (13) proposals, out-of-state consultants recommend that seven (7) projects be funded across six (6) campuses. (See Appendix A.) These projects are expected to provide year-long intensive STEM professional development for K-12 teachers, who often become teacher-leaders in their respective schools.

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of \$1,164,638 in NCLB monies to support the seven (7) LaSIP projects recommended for funding in FY 2013. Projects shall be funded in the amounts and with the stipulations recommended by consultants.
